David Powell: Learning resource interchange, or [LRN](#), is an XML-based specification supported by Microsoft and many other vendors. It gives content creators a standard way to identify, share, update, and create [online content and courseware](#). Learning resource interchange is the first commercial application of the content and management system specification, which was developed by the [e-learning](#) industry and the IMS Global Learning Consortium.
